The Council Bluffs Community
School District offers a
continuum of services to meet
the needs of each student with
an Individualized Education
Program, often called an
IEP. All schools have special
education support services to
meet the needs of students
in the general education
classroom and in more
specialized programs.

The goal of our preschool programs is to provide a high quality preschool experience meeting each child's needs.

The preschool classrooms provide a safe and respectful environment with rich learning opportunities that encourage natural curiosity, increased independence and active involvement by all learners.



Specially Designed Instruction Continuum of Council Bluffs Preschool programs, available to students identified with special needs:

Specially Designed Instruction in General Education Settings - Early Childhood Teacher, with support from Early Childhood Special Education Teacher

• Instruction is provided in the general education setting, as specified in the student's IEP (Individualized Education Program)

Specially Designed Instruction in Integrated General Education Settings - Early Childhood Special Education Teacher

 Individualized Instruction and Curriculum Accommodations are provided in a general education setting to address more significant needs as specified in the student's IEP (Individualized Education Program)

Specially Designed Instruction in Specialized Programs - Early Childhood Special Education Teacher

- Individualized Instruction and Modifications to the General Education Curriculum are provided in a special education setting with a smaller class size, to address more significant needs as specified in the student's IEP (Individualized Education Program)
- This program will provide opportunities for integration into general education settings, as identified in the student's IEP (Individualized Education Program)

Special Education Support Services, provided by Green Hills Area Education Agency staff

- Support services may be provided in a general education setting, or in a separate special education setting, as specified in the student's IEP (Individualized Education Program)
- Support Service Instruction focuses on general education standards
 with accommodations in support areas (Speech, Occupational Therapy,
 Sensory, Physical Therapy, etc) as needed for the student to succeed.
 Generalization of these skills will transfer to the general education
 setting as skills are mastered.
